- Curricular**
1. Academic Calendar was prepared.
 2. Annual Teaching Plans for various courses along with Syllabus Completion Certificate were submitted to the Heads of the Departments by the faculty.
 3. Library was strengthened.
 4. Extra classes for weak and meritorious students were arranged.
 5. New B.Voc. Courses were started: Fashion Technology and Food Science & Quality Control.
 6. The following Add-on courses were introduced: GIS and Remote Sensing, Web-designing. An advanced computer lab was also prepared for the same.
 7. Special fee concession was given to meritorious students.
 8. Free books were issued for the whole year to the meritorious students as well as SC and BC students.

1. Field Visits were organised.
 2. Annual college and inter-college activities were organised.
 3. Seminars, workshops and extension lectures were organised for the benefit of faculty and students.
 4. Students were encouraged to take up Seminars in the classes.

- A wide range of extra-curricular activities were organized to make the staff and students more zealous and determined towards the higher goals of life.
- A large number of events were organized to showcase the creativity of students and to encourage them to pursue their passion in life.
- Staff and students made many excursions to places of educational and cultural significance to get connected with both science and history of those places.
- A great deal of effort was made to create social awareness amongst the students to increase their social quotient.

- Proposal for Day- and – Night Lighting of indoor multipurpose hall, creation of Tennis Court and Volley Ball Court are in pipe line after the demolition of Science Block. Proposal has been sent to UGC for grants under sports scheme.
- Computerised ID cards are made mandatory for all the students.
- Provision of advance against salary to the members of teaching and non-teaching staff.
- Residential facility was provided for the members of non-teaching staff at Ram Nagar School.
- In case of emergency, outside medical facility is provided.
- Ms. Anand & Anand, Chandigarh was appointed architect for the construction of Arts & Home Science Block.
- The construction work was allotted to M/s S.K. Constructions for new Arts building.
- WhatsApp groups of students were formed by each faculty. Principal is available on it 24/7.
- Feedback on the prescribed proforma was filled by the students and parents.
- Construction of New Science Block was complete. Furniture is to be purchased.
- Proposal for the installation of lift in the New Science Block.
- Renovation of Herbal Garden was done. New plants were added.
- Class IV employees were to be employed through contract system only.
- Hostel: Construction of Mess, Hostel Office, Deluxe Rooms- A.C. Rooms (04), Non-AC Rooms: (04), Geysers (01), water Tank (03), Bhatti, (01) Air Conditioners (12), Purifiers (03); hostel was whitewashed and washrooms (Deluxe side) were renovated, internet facility.
- 11 CCTV cameras were installed in hostel/campus under Central Surveillance.
- Three water coolers were installed, two in new building and one in commerce block. Regular service of Aqua Guards and ROs was done to provide purified water to students.
- Administrative office was renovated; a mezzanine floor and cabins were created for adding space, at a cost of Rs 16 lakhs.

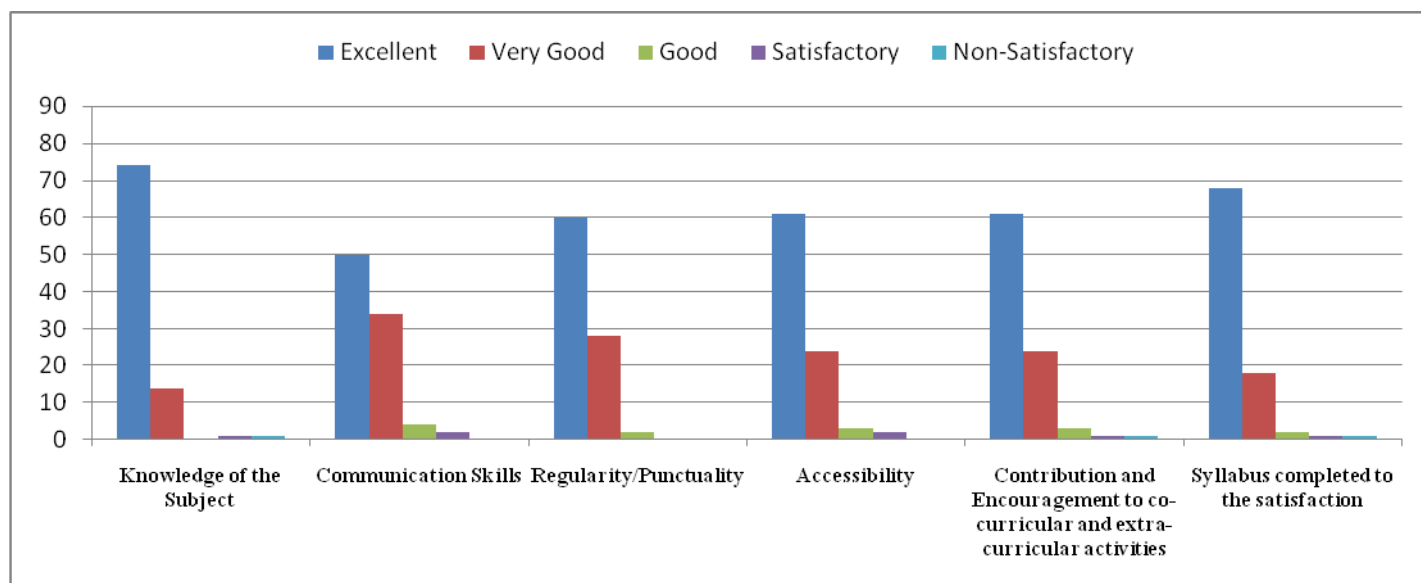

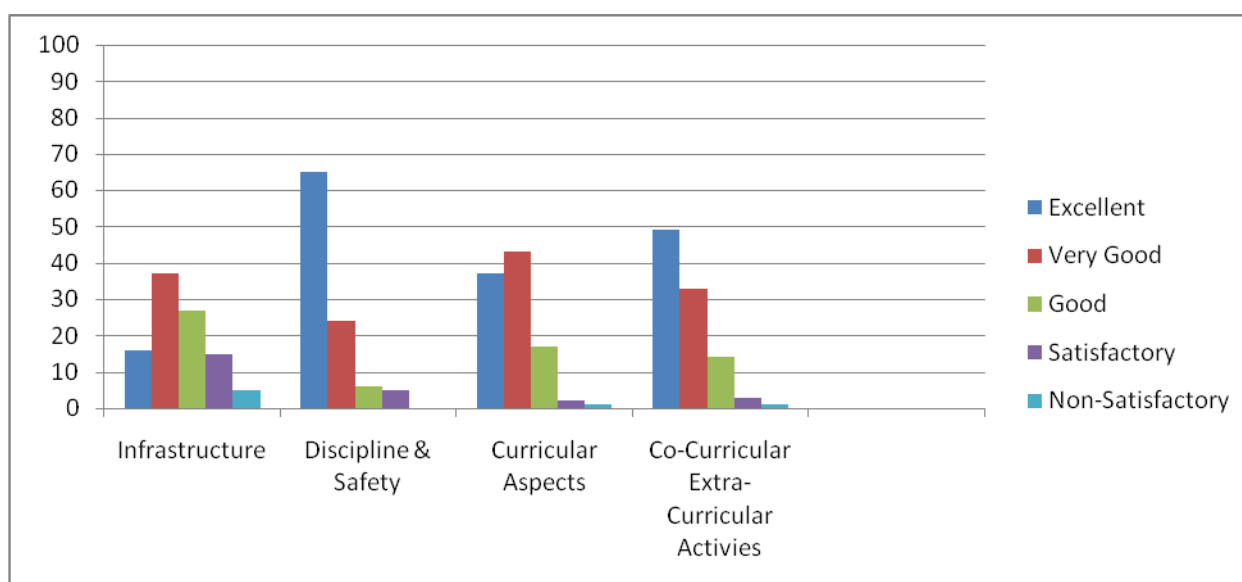

6.1 State the vision and Mission of the institution

- As such the institute is constantly engaged in the promotion and revival of Indian traditional culture, heritage and spiritual philosophy through co-curricular/cultural activities, learned discourses and awareness-raising programmes.

- Envisioning Education to lead to self-realization and self-emancipation through a holistic process of disciplined study of socio-cultural and recorded annals of human thought, logic, experiment and analysis for a gradual evolution towards a better humanity. Thus, we empower and groom young ladies to stand undeterred while walking over rough terrain during the journey of life. We envision the creation of excellent human resource through integration of multi-dimensional Personality Development Programmes with college curriculum.

6.2 Does the institution has a Management Information System?

Yes, the institution has a Management Information System. The Principal keeps in touch with the management through meetings held from time to time in the headquarters of DAV College Managing Committee, New Delhi. Agenda and minutes of each committee meeting are recorded. She also receives written reports of the growth of the institution and its achievements in various fields, term-wise and annually from the faculty. College publications, like News Bulletin, information brochures, e-mails, newspaper reports, too keep the information channel open to the management. After thorough discussions and deliberations, the decisions are taken in the best interests of the college.

The Head of the institution ensures that adequate information (from feedback and personal contacts etc.) is available for the management in the following ways:

- a) By conducting periodical meetings to review the overall progress of the institution.
- b) By the way of personal interaction of the Principal with the faculty and nonteaching staff.
- c) By the way of one-to-one interaction with students at both formal and informal level.
- d) By the way of information available in Student feedback forms.
- e) By the way of interaction of the Principal with the guardians.
- f) Through feedback forms of parents.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

1. The curriculum for various classes is designed by Board of Studies of various departments of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. Senior most teachers are recruited as the members of Board of Studies to design the curriculum of the various courses. Therefore, we have a few faculty members on the Board of Studies of Kurukshetra University from our college. They actively participate in the meetings of these bodies to design the curriculum.
2. Teachers remain on toes to work towards enhancing the professional skills of our students. Hence, we have introduced dual degree programs, add-on courses, and job-oriented programs in the college.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

1. The college has highly qualified and dedicated faculty.
2. The college prepares a monthly activity calendar as per the schedule given in the University Academic Calendar, which is also published in the College prospectus.
3. Each and every department prepares a teaching plan as per the syllabi prescribed by the University for each academic session. Most of the teaching activities are carried out according to the guidelines given in the teaching plan.
4. Teaching is further enhanced with the help of ICT tools like smart boards, visualizers, projectors, computers, EDUSAT, Multi-media etc. Useful study notes from different websites are also made available to the students.
5. Different departments regularly organize Seminars, Extension Lectures, Workshops, Screening of Films, etc to further enrich the contents and texts.
6. We assess profile of every individual student after the University examination results are declared.
7. We organize Educational tours, field visits, surveys from time to time to supplement routine classroom teaching.
8. Various departments of the college, library, administrative office, principal office, and hostel have Wi-Fi connectivity which can be used by the staff members and the brilliant students for the further enhancement of their knowledge.
9. The college magazine provides the students the opportunity to make good use of their creative expression.
10. We aim at the all round development of the personality of the students. So, extra-curricular activities like Debates, Declamation Contests, Rangoli Making Competition, Fashion Shows, sports activities are organized in the college from time to time. Students also participate actively in sports, NCC/NSS, and various other cultural activities.

11. Students can also opt for various Add-on-courses which further add to the enhancement of skills and job opportunities in the concerned sectors.
12. Practical knowledge of the subjects is given to the students in all labs, especially in the subject of English.
13. All the departments arrange extra classes for weak and meritorious students.
14. Social support is given to economically backward students by giving them scholarships and freeships. Free boarding and lodging facility is available to sports students and University merit holders in the College hostel.
15. Apart from the end-semester examinations which are organized and conducted by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, the teachers evaluate the students on the basis of their attendance and participation in the class room discussions, their assignment grades and their performance in the sessionals which comprises their internal assessment. It carries a weightage of approximately 20% in their overall score.
16. The University revises/restructures the syllabi for the different courses from time to time as per the requirement of the subject.
17. Psychological support is provided to our students by the Women Development Cell and Department of Psychology.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

1. The college follows the rules and regulations regarding examination and evaluation as per Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. The College distributes the University examination forms to each individual student and subsequently they get their Roll Number slips issued by the university. The centre of examination is in the college. The University sends question papers and answer sheets. External staff is appointed by the University for supervision. After examination, the answer sheets are packed, sealed, and sent to the central coordinating cell of the University. Viva and Practical exams are conducted in the college by the University representatives. The marking scheme in the University exams is as follows:
 - There is anonymous marking of the answer books.
 - All the answer sheets are coded to keep the result confidential.
 - The question paper also has a code in order to maintain the confidentiality of the exam being conducted.
 - There are computerized signature charts.
 - There is provision of table marking of the answer booklets which are further moderated. The students can apply for re-evaluation or re-checking if they are not satisfied with the result.
2. Besides the examinations conducted by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, the teachers evaluate the students on the basis of their attendance and participation in the class room discussions, their assignment grades and their performance in the sessionals which comprises their internal assessment.
3. The College Advisory Committee evaluates the cause of shortage in attendance, then only the Roll Number Slips are issued to the defaulters. Mostly they have health or domestic issues, where they are helpless. A fine is also levied upon students who are regular defaulters as a punitive measure. However, the financially backward students are exempted from this fine.
4. Students who represent our college at the University, State and National level in various activities like Sports, NSS, Zonal and Inter-Zonal Youth Festival, NCC, (DCATC, PVSC, and VSC, Pre RD, RD Parade), Science Exhibitions, Quiz Competitions, etc get extra weightage in internal assessment.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college has a research committee which strives to inculcate research atmosphere among the faculty members and students.

Quality Improvement Strategies adopted by the College to improve Research and Development are as follows:-

- Teachers are motivated to participate in conferences, seminars and workshops held at the college and other institutions. For this purpose, they are provided duty leave.
- The college organizes Workshops and Extension Lectures/ Demonstrations for students.
- Organization of Hands-on-trainings for students.
- Publication of Research Papers by the faculty in reputed journals.
- Presentation of Papers in Conferences and Seminars.
- Promoting students for research by preparing working models for Exhibitions.
- Teaching through Power Point Presentations.
- Teaching through Tours and visits to various Research Institutes and Industries.

2. Book Bank facility is available to SC/ST and other financially challenged students.
3. The new arrivals rack displays new arrivals of books, journals and magazines whenever we receive the same.
4. Computerized software is used to catalogue, track circulation of books and inventory the library's assets.
5. Prescribed text books are available in the library for the students
6. Model test papers and previous year question papers are available in the library.
7. Encyclopaedias, sets of Vedas, dictionaries and many other books are available in the reference section of the library.
8. There is a good collection of books and magazines for Competition Exams in the library.
9. The Employment News which is published on a weekly basis has also been subscribed.
10. Access to E-resources provided by UGC-INFLIBNET through n-list programs, coordinated by UGC.
11. There is an open shelf reference section in which we have reference books, general knowledge books, encyclopaedias, atlases, dictionaries, thesauruses, biographies, and back volumes of printed journals, magazines, etc.
12. The Library has subscribed: 08 printed journals, 10 newspapers and 29 magazines during this session.

ICT:

1. Smart boards, visualizers, and projectors are available in almost all science labs. Wi-Fi and Internet connections are made available to all the departments, administrative office, hostel, library, and staff room. The college has 4 computer labs with 158 computers and 3 laptops in Department of Geography, Chemistry and Computer respectively. Each department has computers installed as per requirements.

Physical Infrastructure:

1. The College has 40 class rooms and 22 big spacious Labs with latest furniture, equipments and Smart boards (One in Commerce Block and One in Science Block).
2. Air conditioned Computer labs with 158 computers with Broadband & Wi-Fi connectivity.

Well-equipped laboratories with gadgets of latest technology in Biotechnology, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Home Science, Food Processing, Fashion Designing, Cosmetology, Functional English, Geography, Psychology, Music (Instrumental and Vocal) and Office Management and Secretarial Practice.
4. Central Lab facility for Research in life sciences.
5. Well maintained Botanical Garden with a huge and myriad variety of plants and herbs for Botanical study.
6. Fully stocked library having 49994 books National/International Journals, big reading hall, book bank, internet and Photostat facility.
7. Big Multipurpose auditorium with a seating capacity of 2000.
8. A huge and well supplied hygienic canteen.
9. A common room with indoor sports facilities.
10. Well designed, air conditioned seminar hall equipped with multimedia audio visual teaching aids like Interactive Boards and visualizers.
11. All the departments, administrative office, library and hostel have Wi-Fi connectivity.
12. A well-equipped Gym with latest machines/gadgets.
13. Sports Ground at Danialpur Village spreading over 3.5 acres of land.
14. Broadband connections facilitating internet facility for every teaching department library and Hostel.
15. EDUSAT system, based on latest technology and 55" "LCD" is installed to impart Education as per Haryana Govt. instructions.
16. A cheerful hostel on campus with living capacity of 350 students, an adequate dining room, well regulated mess, hygienic toilets and ultramodern amenities like geysers, drinking water coolers with R.O. processors, A.C. rooms, TV, common room, guest room, and computer room with internet facilities.
17. Extension Counter of a nationalized bank.
18. Gardens with beautiful lawns and flowers in College and Hostel.
19. A Book cum Tuck-shop/chat corner/Beauty Parlour.
20. New Science Building with LIFT ADDED THIS YEAR.
21. Students are provided with a secure environment through security service.
22. Transport facility of buses is available in the college. Student commuting from Karnal to Indri, Gharounda, Nilokheri can avail the facility of our buses.
23. Smart board and projectors are regularly used for ICT based teaching.
24. Beauty Parlour and facility of Fashion Designing is available in the college.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

1. There is no unilateral decision taken. Horizontal communication levels are used extensively in the institution. Most of the important matters are discussed in the Advisory Committee meetings which are held regularly. This committee consists of 8 senior most staff and Head Clerk. Other than that, there are statutory committees which function independently. There are 08 administrative committees and 25 clubs and societies on all fronts.
2. Orientation and training programmes are periodically organized for new recruits, both in teaching and non-teaching staff in order to enhance their working capacity and potential.
3. Along with the routine classroom teaching, the faculty of the college is also engaged in various curricular and extra-curricular activities. Hence, there is a maximization of human resource through various activities that give them the required confidence to take up any academic/non-academic challenge head on.
4. Regular meetings of various committees are held in Principal office and by HoDs in their concerned departments to draw plans and to get them implemented.
5. Recreational programmes and get-togethers are organized for teaching, non-teaching and supportive staff to give them an opportunity to meet each other in leisure.
6. Students are an integral part of college. Their suggestions are invited periodically by holding the meetings of the Students' Council.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

1. The recruitment of faculty and non-teaching staff is done strictly by following the rules and regulations laid down by UGC, Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra, and Haryana Administration.
2. The College gives pay scales as per the UGC rules & security of service is assured to the permanent faculty & non-teaching staff members. 95% of the salary is paid by the government under grant-in-aid scheme and 5% is paid by the college from its resources. All the staff members are part of P.F. scheme of the management committee.
3. Contractual staff is appointed for unaided and self-financed courses through proper selection and merit. The staff is paid as per the resources available course wise.
4. Sometimes, the college appoints its exceptionally knowledgeable retired teachers as guest faculty to benefit from their experience.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction/Collaboration

1. The Career Guidance and Placement Cell of our college keeps in touch with industries at the local, regional and national level. The significant information gained through these interactions helps us to decide what should be incorporated in the various courses of the college to meet the demands of the industry. Collaborative efforts are put in by involving various industries and research organizations like Panipat Thermal Plant, Panipat, Leather Industry, Libertypuram, Gharunda, Rice Mill Industry, Kaithal Road, Karnal, NDRI, DWR, MSME, etc to hold seminars, lectures, workshops and symposia regularly.
2. These industrial visits and field trips which are organized from time to time by all the departments to get first hand information.
3. Students are sent for placement meets organized by various industries.
4. We send our students to attend various training programmes in various reputed industries related to their field of study.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

1. KVA DAV College for Women, Karnal is a premier institution of Haryana with the distinction of being the first women's college in the state. It has been declared a "Model College" and "Pace Setting Women's College" by National Institute of Education, Planning and Administration in 1992. The prospectus contains all the necessary information of admission related topics. It is given to the applicants along with the application form. We follow the procedure of the merit list to admit students in various courses.
2. The college follows the Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra reservation policy for all classes with regards to various categories like SC/ST/OBC/Physically Handicapped etc.
3. Sports students (National/State Position) are given extra weightage at the time of admission.
4. NCC Cadets who passed the 'C' or 'G-II' Certificate get weightage.
5. The college allows partial payment of dues from poor students, and exemption in college fees.

7.3. Give two Best Practices of the institution

a) DIET CLINIC – DIET INSIGHT

Knowledge of diet and nutrition is of immense importance to lead a healthy and disease-free life. Looking at today's scenario where diabetes mellitus, cardio-disorders, kidney diseases, liver disorder etc. are increasing at a fast rate, we made a humble attempt to give our students a thorough insight into the mechanism of dietary modifications in nutrition by starting a DIET Clinic in the college. Emphasis was placed on home based therapies wherever possible. Therapeutic adaptations of the normal diet with the common dietary modifications were discussed with the students/patients.

Since good nutrition acts as a preventive, promotive, curative and rehabilitative approach – both for normal and diseased conditions, this DIET clinic works for one and all. The objectives of this practice were:

- To sensitize the students and staff regarding the importance of balanced-diet.
- Therapeutic diet charts for metabolic disorders and various diseases such as diabetes, hyper-tension, obesity etc.
- Special diets were planned for conditions like pregnancy and lactation.
- To promote the concept of eating healthy as per the budget by inculcating "Be Smart When You Shop" concept among the students.
- Usage of seasonal food was encouraged. Introduction to variety of preparation using microwave oven, grill etc. was given.
- Organized interactive sessions for students.

The services of DIET clinic yielded satisfactory results:

- It helped to create healthy and hygienic environment in the college.
- It made students more conscious about their eating habits esp. related to junk food and irregular eating timings.
- It created awareness about the importance of diet in one's life.
- It created opportunity for sharing the knowledge and removing the common food related fads.
- It tackled health hazards by maintaining good health and hygiene.
- It created awareness about food safety.

b) HOSTEL MESS FACILITIES

- The city of Karnal is flanked by numerous villages. The parents from rural areas are keen to provide higher education to their girl children. The availability of a safe, comfortable living place (hostel) within the premises of the educational institute therefore becomes a must. Our college is the only degree college in district Karnal & Panipat that runs a girls' hostel. Our hostel is a 'home away from home' for our girls. It houses approximately 300 students, out of which about 200 are undergraduate & 50 Post-graduate students.
- The college started running the hostel mess on mutual cooperation basis from the session 2012-2013 onwards. In the beginning, various items were purchased for the hostel mess such as utensils, fridge, chapatti-maker, diesel bhatti, mixer grinder etc. A mess committee comprising senior staff members and students is formulated at the beginning of each session. The students are consulted for menu preparation. Purchasing is done from wholesale vendors. Simple vegetarian 3-meal diet is provided along with evening tea. A provision for special diets at zero extra cost is available for sick students & also those who are fasting especially during 'Navaratri'.
 - Since it is a self-run mess-system, special provision of diet has been made for our sportspersons who have brought laurels to the college.
 - The entire exercise needs a lot of effort, concern and patience. We truly believe that with time & experience we shall be able to evolve healthier & effective food-facilities in our college hostel.

7.4. Contribution to environmental awareness/protection.

- Minimum energy consumption is practiced in the college. Our college strictly follows the motto, “Energy saved is energy gained.” The college uses CFL bulbs instead of tungsten lamps.
- Tree-plantation drives are organized specially during rainy season within and outside the college premises with the help of State Forest Department. The saplings of different fruit-trees are distributed amongst the staff and students. Ozone Depletion Day is also keenly celebrated.
- Eco-awareness campaign is organized to create eco-friendly attitude amongst the students. This includes a motivational address by a subject expert from the vicinity. Declamation, painting and quiz competition, power point presentations are also organized.
- Bio-degradable kitchen waste management programme continued. Hostel Kitchen waste as well as the litter was effectively used to prepare Organic Manure through Vermi-composting technique. They were also put on sale.
- Out-dated computers were donated to other schools run by the D.A.V. management. Some of the computers and their accessories were also sold as scrap to local vendors. Many of our systems are upgraded to minimize E-wastage.
- Eco-Club, NSS, NCC, etc. create Eco-consciousness at different levels.
- The college bus and other vehicles are checked by the RTO and provided with CNG pollution free stickers. Car pooling is done by staff for transport and conveyance. Carbon emission is minimized by Polyalthia pathways at the entrance of college. Planting a variety of trees and ornamental plants have contributed to carbon neutrality in the campus.
- Electronic goods are put to optimum use, the minor repairs are set right by the electrician and laboratory assistance and the major repairs are done by the professional technician and are re-used.
- Despite the lack of space we have made all the efforts to maintain greenery in the college campus.
- The Botanical Garden has a green house, a hill-top and a pond for aquatic plants.




