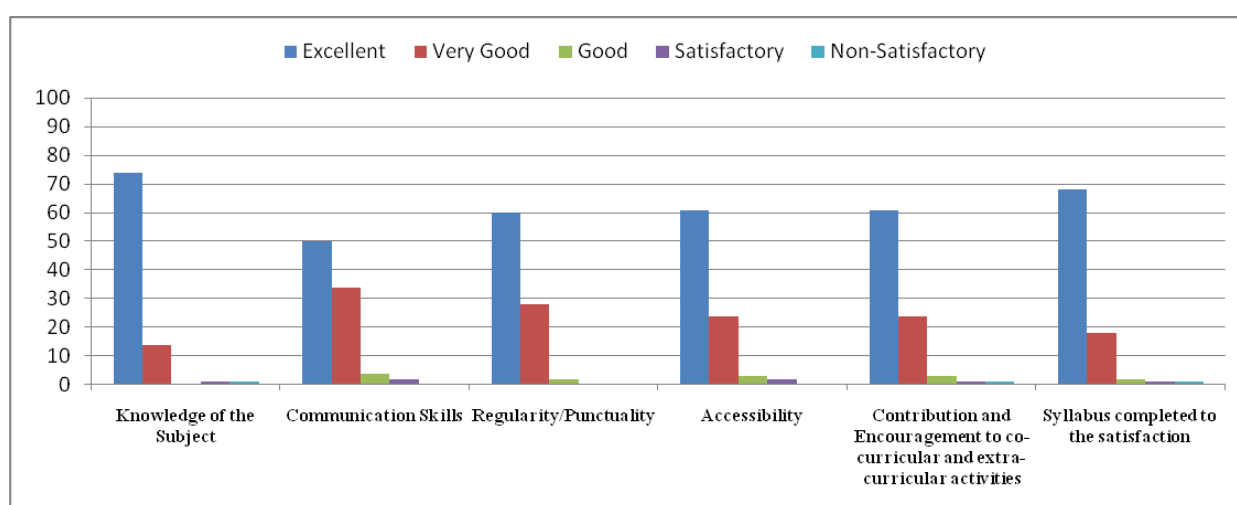

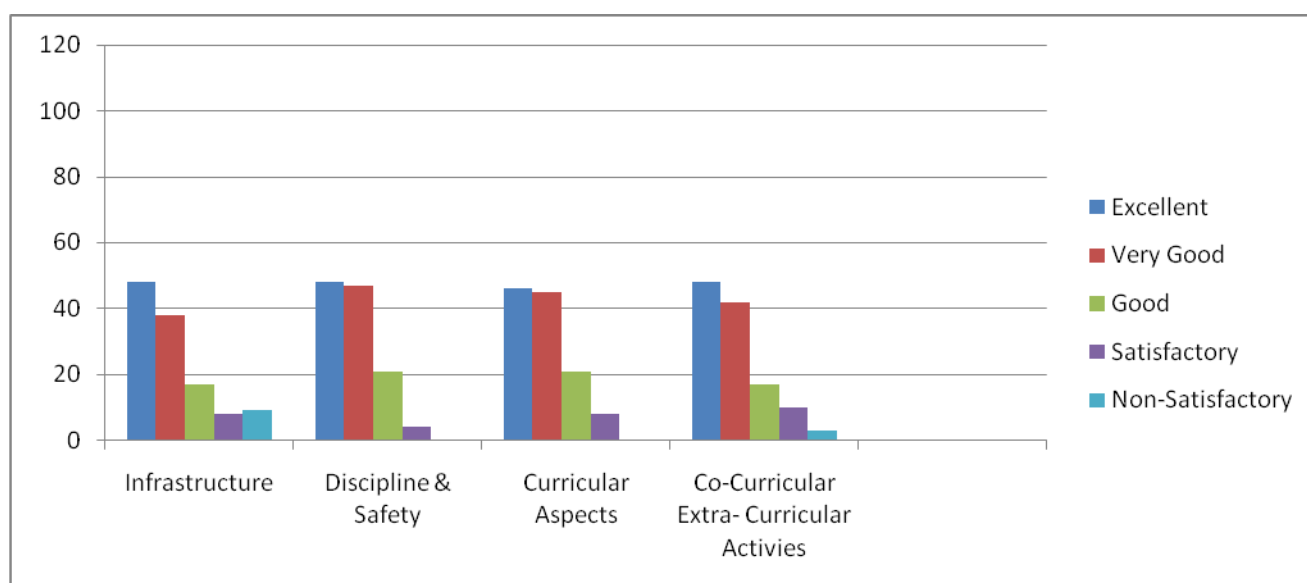

6.1 State the vision and Mission of the institution.

K.VA D.A.V. College for Women, Karnal was founded in the year 1958 and now advancing the aegis of D.A.V. Managing Committee, New Delhi with the avowed aim of spreading the benefits of education to women, synchronizing tradition with modernity.

- Epitomizing the philosophy of “Vidya Dadati Vinyam”, the college is committed to perceive that all the learners grow up to be refined human beings and be able to assume positive and fulfilling role in nation building and promoting a culture of peace and prudence.

We envision the creation of excellent human resource through integration of multi-dimensional Personality Development Programmes with college curriculum.

6.2 Does the institution has a Management Information System?

Yes, our institution has a Management Information System. The management and head of the institution are always in interactive mode with each other. College publications like News bulletin, information brochures, e-mails and newspaper reports keep the information channel open to the management. Our Principal receives written reports of the growth of the institution and its achievements in various fields, term-wise and annually from the faculty and forwards these to the management from time to time. The Heads of departments ensure the smooth functioning of the activities of the department in collaboration with other members of the department. Regular meetings of the Staff Council are held to discuss and decide on matters relating to academics and administration. For the smooth and effective functioning of the College, interactions with stakeholders comprising of faculty, parents, alumnae and the students, are regularly organized. Feedback received from faculty, students, alumnae and other stake-holders are considered for continuous review and revision of the existing infrastructure and facilities.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

1. Curriculum Development is undertaken by the affiliating University, i.e., The Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra and we follow it. The University recruits the members of Board of Studies according to the seniority of the teachers to design the curriculum of the various courses. Therefore, we have a few faculty members on the Board of Studies of Kurukshetra University from our college. These members exchange views with other teachers/ chairpersons of the concerned department to design the curriculum.
2. All the departments prepare a teaching plan based on the curriculum prescribed by the Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra at the beginning of each academic session in order to streamline classroom teaching.
3. Keeping in mind the cut throat competition in this global era, we have introduced dual degree programs in order to increase the employability of our students. As the name suggests, the course has an intensive, work based curriculum which braces the students for gaining practical skills which they may not get in an integrated programme. It is a type of part-time course which can be pursued with any regular course of study.
4. The college has been sanctioned permission to run Diploma in Health Care by UGC under Community College Scheme It is much sought-after as it is job-oriented course. The number of seats offered is 50.
5. Students are advised to opt for at least one add-on course to take advantage of hands-on training and developing skills which is the need of the hour in this world of globalization and competition.
6. B. Voc programme of the UGC was sanctioned only on the basis of excellence in designing of the curriculum of each course prepared by the departments.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

1. An Academic Calendar is issued by Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra, at the beginning of each academic session, which is followed by the college. A Monthly Activity Calendar is further prepared by the college as per the schedule given in the University Academic Calendar, which is also published in the College Prospectus.
2. A teaching plan is prepared by each and every department as per the syllabi prescribed by the University for different courses for the current academic session. Most of the teaching activities are based on the guidelines given in the teaching plan. Teaching is further enhanced with the help of ICT tools like smart boards, visualizers, projectors, computers, Multi-media tools, etc. Useful study notes from different websites are also made available to the students.
3. Seminars, Extension Lectures, Workshops, Screenings of Documentary Films and Literary texts, etc are regularly organized by different departments to further enrich the contents and texts.
4. Individual student profile is assessed after the University examination results are out.
5. Educational tours, field visits, surveys are organized to supplement routine classroom teaching.
6. The college campus has Wi-Fi connectivity which can be used by the students for the further enhancement of their knowledge.
7. The college magazine provides the students the opportunity to make good use of their creative expression. Extra-curricular activities like Debates, Declamation Contests, Music Competition, Rangoli Competition, Fashion Shows, sports activities are organized in the college from time to time for the overall development of the students. Students also participate actively in sports, NCC/NSS, and various other cultural activities.
8. Students can also opt for various Add-on courses which further add to the enhancement of skills and job opportunities in the concerned sectors.
9. Practical knowledge of the subjects is given to the students in all labs, especially in the subject of English.
10. Extra classes for weak and meritorious students are held in all streams regulated by the HoDs.
11. Social support is given to economically backward students by giving them scholarships and freeships. Free boarding and lodging facility is available to sports students and University merit holders in the College hostel.
12. Apart from the end-semester examinations which are organized and conducted by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, the teachers evaluate the students on the basis of their attendance and participation in the class room discussions, their assignment grades and their performance in the sessionals which comprises their internal assessment.
13. The University revises/restructures the syllabi for the different courses from time to time as per the requirement of the subject.
14. Psychological support is provided to our students by the Women Development Cell and Department of Psychology.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

1. The college follows the rules and regulations regarding examination and evaluation as per Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. The College distributes the University examination forms to each individual student and subsequently they get their Roll Number slips issued by the university. The centre of examination is in the college. The University sends question papers and answer sheets. External staff is appointed by the University for supervision. After examination, the answer sheets are packed, sealed, and sent to the central coordinating cell of the University. Viva and Practical exams are conducted in the college by the University representatives. The marking scheme in the University exams is as follows:
 - There is anonymous marking of the answer books.
 - All the answer sheets are coded to keep the result confidential.
 - The question paper also has a code in order to maintain the confidentiality of the exam being conducted.
 - There are computerized signature charts.
 - There is provision of table marking of the answer booklets which are further moderated. The students can apply for re-evaluation or re-checking if they are not satisfied with the result.
2. Apart from the end-semester examinations which are organized and conducted by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, the teachers evaluate the students on the basis of their attendance, their assignment grades and their performance in the sessionals which comprises their internal assessment. Extra weightage is given to students who represent our college at the University, State and National level in various activities like Sports, NCC/NSS, Youth Festival, RD Parade, Science Exhibitions, Quiz Competitions, etc.
3. To support the cause of Women Education and to bolster the ambitious scheme of “Beti Bachao Beti Padhao,” the College Advisory Committee issues hall tickets to students with short attendance record after evaluating the cause of shortage. Mostly they have health or domestic issues, where they are helpless. A fine is also levied upon students who are regular defaulters as a punitive measure. However, the financially backward students are exempted from this fine.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college administration actively supports research and development by encouraging the faculty in the following ways:

- The college has a Research Committee dedicated to encouraging the inculcation of research aptitude among the faculty members.
- The Head of the Institution motivates teachers to present research papers in conferences, seminars and workshops held at the college and other institutions. For this purpose, they are provided duty leave and Registration Fee.
- The college organizes Workshops, Seminars and Extension Lectures/ Demonstration for the benefit of students.
- Publication of Research Papers by the faculty in reputed journals.
- Encouraging students for research by preparing working models for Exhibitions.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure/instrumentation

Library: The College has a fully automated library. It is open for students from 8.00 am to 5.00 pm. The details of the library facilities are mentioned below:-

1. Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) has been made available to users to identify the status of availability of documents.
2. A suggestion box has been installed. The valuable suggestions received from the students are analyzed by the Library Advisory Committee for further implementation.
3. Orientation Programme for students was organized to guide them regarding optimum usage of library facilities.
4. New arrivals of books, journals and magazines are displayed on the new arrivals rack.
5. Book Bank facility is available to SC/ST and other financially challenged students.
6. Copies of prescribed text books are available.
7. Model test papers and previous year question papers are available.
8. Internet browsing, photocopy, printing and scanning facility are available at nominal rates for both students and faculty.
9. There is a good collection of books and magazines for Competitive Exams.
10. The Employment News which is published on a weekly basis has also been subscribed.
11. Access to E-resources is provided by UGC-INFLIBNET through N-list programme.
12. There is an open shelf reference section.
13. The reading room has open access to 11 newspapers and 29 magazines.

ICT:

1. Visualizers, and projectors are available in almost all science labs. Wi-Fi and internet connections were made available to all the departments, administrative office, hostel, library, and staff room. The college has 4 labs for the Department of Computer and 1 computerized lab each for the Department of Mathematics, English and Bio-tech respectively with a total of 178 computers.

Physical Infrastructure:

1. The college has 40 class rooms and 22 big spacious labs with latest furniture and equipments
2. Air conditioned Computer Labs with 178 computers with Wi-Fi connectivity.
3. Well-equipped Laboratories with gadgets of latest technology in Biotechnology, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Home Science, Food Processing, Fashion Designing, Cosmetology, Functional English, Geography, Psychology, Music (Instrumental & Vocal) and Office Management and Secretarial Practice.
4. Central Lab facility for Research in life sciences.
5. Well-maintained Botanical Garden with a huge and myriad variety of plants and herbs for Botanical study.
6. Well- stocked library with 50765 books, National/International Journals, big reading hall, book bank, internet and photostat facility.
7. Big multipurpose Auditorium with a seating capacity of 2000.
8. A huge and well-supplied hygienic canteen. A common room with indoor sports facilities.
9. New Science building with lift along with well-designed, air conditioned seminar hall equipped with multimedia.
10. Sports Ground at Village Danialpur spreading over 3.5 acres of land.
11. EDUSAT system, based on latest technology and 55” “LCD” is installed to impart Education as per Haryana Govt. instructions.
12. A cheerful hostel on campus with living capacity of 350 students, an adequate dining room, well-regulated mess, hygienic toilets and ultramodern amenities like geysers, drinking water coolers with R.O., A.C. rooms, TV, common room, guest room and computer room with internet facilities in the Library.
13. There is an extension counter of a Nationalized Bank.
14. Gardens with beautiful lawns and flowers in college and hostel.
15. A Beauty Clinic offering beauty services at nominal charges.
16. Students are provided with a secure environment through security services, CCTV Cameras, etc.
17. Smart board and projectors are used for ICT based teaching.
18. R.O. and water coolers are installed at all major points.
19. New Home Science Block and Arts/ Commerce Block is under construction.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

1. Orientation and training programmes are periodically organized for new recruits, both in teaching and non-teaching staff in order to enhance their working capacity and potential.
2. Faculty members are encouraged to apply for higher studies.
3. Regular meetings of various committees are held to draw plans and to get them implemented.
4. Most of the important matters are discussed in the Advisory Committee meetings which are held regularly. This committee consists of 8 senior most staff members and Head Clerk. Other than that, there are statutory committees which function independently. There are 18 administrative committees and 26 clubs and societies on all fronts.
5. Along with the routine classroom teaching, the faculty of the college is also engaged in various curricular and extra-curricular activities. Hence, there is a maximization of human resource through various activities that give them the required confidence to take up any academic/non-academic challenge head on.
6. Recreational programmes and get-togethers are organized for teaching, non-teaching and supportive staff to give them an opportunity to meet each other in leisure.
7. Students are an integral part of college. Their suggestions are invited periodically by holding the meetings of the Students' Council.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

1. Whenever there are regular vacancies, advertisements are published in leading newspapers by DAV College Managing Committee, New Delhi.
2. The recruitment of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff is done by the DAV College Managing Committee according to the rules and regulations of UGC, Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra, and Haryana Administration.
3. The College gives pay scales as per the UGC rules & security of service is assured to the permanent faculty & non-teaching staff members. 95% of the salary is paid by the government under grant-in-aid scheme and 5% is paid from the college resources.
4. Contractual staff is appointed for unaided and self-financed courses through proper selection panel and merit.
5. Sometimes the College appoints its exceptionally knowledgeable retired teachers as guest faculty to benefit from their experience.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction/Collaboration

1. The Placement Cell along with various departments of the college remains on its toes to develop ties with industries at the local, regional and national level. It provides significant information to the experts regarding what should be incorporated in the various courses of the college to meet the demands of the industry. Collaborative efforts are put in by involving various industries and research organizations like Panipat Thermal Plant (Panipat), Leather Industry (Gharunda), Rice Mill Industry (Karnal) NDRI, DWDR, MSME, Ashwani Knitting Techniques (Ludhiana) etc to hold training/internships, seminars, lectures, workshops and symposia regularly.
2. Students are sent for placement meets organized by various industries.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

1. KVA DAV College for Women, Karnal is a premier institution of Haryana with the distinction of being the first women's college in the state. It has been declared a "Model College" and "Pace Setting Women's College" by National Institute of Education, Planning and Administration in 1992. The prospectus contains all the necessary information of admission related topics. The admissions are done according to the norms of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.
2. Sports students (National/State Position) are given extra weightage at the time of admission.
3. The college follows the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra reservation policy for all classes with regards to various categories like SC/ST/OBC/PH, etc.
4. Social support is given to poor students in the form of reservation for economically backward students belonging to the general category. The college allows partial payment of dues from economically backward students.
5. NCC Cadets who pass the 'C' or 'G-II' Certificate, NSS get weightage.
6. Students who attain excellence/merit in academics, sports are accorded fee waivers in the college fees.

• **Stress Management through Counseling:**

Kumari Vidyavati Anand DAV College for Women, Karnal has introduced psychological counseling which strives to ensure the welfare of the students by providing them emotional assistance. The counseling helps the students to overcome difficulties related to institutional, environmental, studies and other personal issues. Students, if not guided properly, may face depression, study stress, loneliness, and even commit suicide. Students coming to hostel for the first time need counseling and proper guidance. Our motive is to help the students to become confident so that they can deal with day-to-day problems on their own.

- **Awareness about the Insurance Practices**

Types of Insurance or its awareness is very low among the public. Due to negligence and lack of communication from the sources concerned, the people are not capable of utilizing the immense protective coverage made available to them by the Govt. of India through the public as well as the private sector Insurance companies. Even the educated consumer is not aware of the various insurance practices available in the market. The objectives of this practice are:

- To make the students and staff aware about the meaning, nature, types and scope of insurance practices in India.
- To create awareness about the need of insurance.
- To inform about the various insurance schemes available in public and private sector.
- To make students aware about career prospects in insurance.

7.4. Contribution to environmental awareness/protection.

- Bio-degradable kitchen waste management programme continued. Hostel Kitchen waste as well as the litter was effectively used to prepare Organic Manure through Vermi-composting technique. They were also put on sale.
- Tree-plantation drives are organized specially during rainy season within and outside the college premises with the help of State Forest Department. The saplings of different fruit-trees are distributed amongst the staff and students. Ozone Depletion Day is also keenly celebrated.
- Out-dated computers were donated to other schools run by the D.A.V. management. Some of the computers and their accessories were also sold as scrap to local vendors. Many of our systems are upgraded to minimize E-wastage.
- Eco-awareness campaign is organized to create eco-friendly attitude amongst the students. This includes a motivational address by a subject expert from the vicinity. Declamation, painting and quiz competition, power point presentations are also organized.
- Eco-Club, NSS, NCC, etc. create Eco-consciousness at different levels.
- Minimum energy consumption is practiced in the college. Our college strictly follows the motto, "Energy saved is energy gained." The college uses CFL bulbs instead of tungsten lamps.
 - Proper measures have been taken to reduce carbon emission to keep the campus clean and uncontaminated. It is minimized by Polyalthia pathways at the entrance of college. Planting a variety of trees and ornamental plants have contributed to carbon neutrality in the campus.
 - The college bus and other vehicles are checked by the RTO and provided with CNG pollution free stickers. Car pooling is done by staff for transport and conveyance. Electronic goods are put to optimum use, the minor repairs are set right by the electrician and laboratory assistance and the major repairs are done by the professional technician and are re-used.
 - Despite the lack of space we have made all the efforts to maintain greenery in the college campus.
 - The Botanical Garden has a green house, a hill-top and a pond for aquatic plants.




