1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

As the college is affiliated to Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, so it is obligatory on the college to follow "scheme and curriculum" as prescribed by

the university for various courses. College has, over the years, developed its own strong mechanism to effectively implement university curriculum. In consensus with KUK, the college prepares the Academic Plan including the rules and regulations and Prospectus which is uploaded on the college website before the commencement of the session. 'Annual Academic Calendar' gives a detailed account of various academic activities to be undertaken by various departments/clubs/societies. This helps in timely scheduling as well as completion of all such activities. The college initiates various steps to augment the curriculum aspects as to meet the expectations of the stakeholders:

(a) For timely completion of syllabus, every teacher prepares Lesson Plan which is displayed on the college notice board. (b) All Head of the Departments regularly interact with their faculty on the progress made regarding adherence to weekly schedule. Students are also encouraged to give their feedback on the same. (c) It is mandatory for the students to submit assignments (after part completion of the syllabus). (d) Mid semester sessional test is conducted for each subject and a proper schedule is circulated in this regard. (e) The two assignments, sessional per subject along with attendance contribute towards the Internal Assessment in the final semester examination conducted by the University. (f) The students prepare PowerPoint Presentations and present them through intra-class seminars which supports the curriculum pursuits of the students. (g) Additional surprise tests/quizzes/discussions/debates/declamations, etc. are conducted on regular basis. (h) Activity calendar is prepared by every department and they organise activities according to the schedule. (i) Department wise subject results are maintained by the faculty with the help of university gazette. The results are analysed and weak students are contacted personally to support their curricular needs. (j) Every department has a Notice Board where achievements of students, college activities, advertisements of various universities/job opportunities/scholarships, etc. are displayed to promote curricular aspects and higher studies among students. (k) Teaching faculty is encouraged to offer extra classes/doubt sessions for meritorious as well as academically weak students. (l) A digital display board continuously circulates all related information to the concerned. Besides, the college also focuses on other activities for curriculum enhancement. (a) College regularly organizes national/international Interdisciplinary and subject specific Webinars/Seminars/Conferences/Workshops/Guest Lectures wherein renowned experts from other institute and universities are invited to share their knowledge for faculty and students. (b) A well-established mentor-mentee system has been designed in the college. Each student is assigned a mentor who counsels and guides in all issues related to academics and job placement. (c) The college is fully equipped with various teaching technologies. The wi-fi campus enabled the faculty members to sustain quality teaching even in Covid 19 pandemic situation through online classes from March 2020 onwards till date.

1.4.2 – How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution?

Feedback Obtained
<p>College has implemented a very effective mechanism for collecting and analysing the feedback collected from different stakeholders like students, teachers, alumni and parents. After the feedback is ready a brain storming is carried out and corrective measures are taken for improving the academic and research ambience. Various methods to collect feedback from different stakeholders are:</p> <p>(a) Suggestion Box: It is installed near the office where anyone can put his/her suggestions (in written form). The box is regularly opened and after segregation, feedback is passed on to concerned persons for collecting suggestions and implementation of measures to improve quality of the education being imparted in the college. (b) Email: Anyone can correspond through college email on any topic, which concerns the academic/research/cultural or any other activity of the college. (c) Feedback Form Students' Satisfaction Survey Form: Every student is expected to express his/her views in the Feedback Form available in the college. Suggestion Form and Students' Satisfaction Survey Form is available on the college website. The students may download and submit the filled form in the college. (d) A 'Visitor Book' is maintained in the Principal's office where all the guests share their views about the college after their visit. These views are studied and actions are taken on these. Other main features of feedback mechanism being adopted in the college are: (a) Principal and teaching staff regularly meet for open and free discussions related to academic/cultural/sports issues of the students and committees are set up for speedy implementation of all welfare measures. (b) All HOD's hold regular meetings at departmental level to ensure speedy redressal of academic and research issues of the students and teachers. (c) Principal and non-teaching employees also have regular meetings to take up feedback, suggestions and advice of different stakeholders. This ensures transparency and speedy decision making. (d) Student Council (representation of students from all classes, clubs, societies) is formed and regular meetings are held with the Principal and teaching faculty of Youth Welfare Society to discuss various academic as well as the non-academic issues of the students. (e) Hostel Committee is formed in the beginning of every session with Principal, Convener from teaching faculty, Warden, faculty members and students for hostel residents to ensure discipline, cleanliness and quality of food. As a result of feedback obtained from the hostel residents, an eco- friendly dispenser for used sanitary-napkins of the girls was installed. Gathering from this experience, a similar incinerator has been installed in the college restroom for the students by Women Development Cell of the college. This has been appreciated by one and all. (f) Parents of the students and alumni are</p>

regularly invited to college premises to interact with the students and the teachers. This fair and frank discussion ensures free exchange of ideas and suggestions useful for academic ambience of the college. (g) Since 'Kurukshetra University' is the overall administrative authority academic issues of the students (which need university intervention) are conveyed to university bodies like BOS, Academic Council, etc.

The institute is practising a Mentor-Mentee system since last many years. For the current session, student-mentor ratio is 22:1. Students are continuously monitored by their academic counsellor. The following activities are carried out on monthly basis. • Psychological assistance is provided for personal problems. • Significance of being punctual and disciplined in the classroom is instilled in our students. • Discussions regarding shortage of attendance its causes. • WhatsApp groups are created for their round the clock help. • Counselling the students for career guidance like Post-Graduation, Competitive Exams, and Coaching etc. • Feedback of the students to improve the quality of college life. • Promotes fellow-feeling among students. • Strengthens the bond between students teachers. • Helps in one-to-one interaction with students. • Total concentration and focus on developing the overall growth of students. • Academic, curricular and extra-curricular issues are dealt with utmost care. • Helps in enhancing the interest of students regarding studies, social service and many areas of life by widening their perspective. • Provides the students a platform for sharing their common concerns. • Builds up the feeling and spirit of team work among students as they work together to find solutions to their problems. Measures taken for Online teaching amid COVID: • Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there was a sudden shift away from the classroom to e-learning in many parts of the globe. - Internal assessment and sessionals are conducted to evaluate the performance of the students.
- Power Point Presentations, Live Models and Charts are used as teaching aids for students.
- More emphasis is given on practical part of the Syllabus.
- Lesson Plan is prepared before the commencement of the semester by the concerned subject teachers.
- Content is delivered according to the Lesson Plan.
- The slow learners are identified, special guidance and remedial classes are conducted for them.
- Retests are scheduled for students who secure passing marks in sessional.
- The students having less than 75 of the mandatory attendances are cautioned to attend classes as failure to do so might bar them from appearing for exams. (if not on medical leave).
- Rules regarding attendance are mentioned in the Prospectus and conveyed verbally to the students from time to time. A written notice is also sent to the parents of the students who fall short of 75 of attendance.
- As per university guidelines, the student who are absent from classes without leave for 14 days continuously, are struck off from the nominal roll. Such students are given one chance of re-admission.
- Attendance registers of the faculty are duly signed by the HOD and principal at the end of each semester.
- Question Banks are prepared by the faculty members for the students.
- Teachers share academic progress and growth of the students with their parents. They are shown assessment results, portfolios and assignments of their wards. It is an excellent opportunity for parents to become familiar with the learning curve of their wards.

The physical and academic facilities are maintained regularly. The computer systems and network facility is upgraded regularly with latest configuration and technology. There are 235 computers in the institute and all are connected to internet. Staff and students can access internet facility free of charge. A senior faculty heads a committee of faculty members and supporting staff to look after the infrastructure. Laboratories are periodically upgraded and sanitization of laboratories is also taken care of by the Lab Attendants. 4. Laboratory equipments and chemicals are regularly maintained by

laboratory attendants of the concerned departments. Department wise stock registers are also maintained by them under the supervision of administrative staff. 5. The maintenance of the reading room and stock verification of library books is done regularly by the library staff. Library software is also regularly maintained by AMC. 6. Disinfection and cleaning of the college premises is also done on priority basis. 7. Computer literacy/ training programme is carried out every year for first year students of all disciplines. 8. A Hostel Committee ensures healthy, clean and hygienic stay for the students. Cots, fans, tube-lights, TV, cooking vessels, cooking stoves etc. are maintained by the Warden through periodical verification. 9. First Aid facility is also provided to the students by the college. A doctor is nominated for the same who visits the college during prescribed hours to provide medical treatment. 10. In the Open-air Gym: Twister, Stepper, Walker, Cross-trainer are installed. 11. Under the supervision of a senior faculty from Botany Department, watch and ward staff and gardeners look after the security and timely thinning, weeding, mulching and fertilizing of the lawns. 12. Maintenance and repairing of IT infrastructure such as computers, internet facilities including Wi-Fi and broadband and updation of software by computer technicians is done through outsourcing. 13. Lifts, biometric machine and website of the college are maintained through AMC. Generators, ROs, CCTV cameras, digital notice board are regularly maintained. 14. Outsourcing is done for the maintenance of wooden furniture, electrification, painting and plumbing. 15. The college has bus facility also (one Bus and one Winger) for educational and excursion tours of the students. 16. Various advanced equipment like CCTV cameras and fire-fighting systems are also installed in the campus. 17. Solar Power Plant with 46 KWP capacities has also been installed in the college.

The vital function of the college is attributed to administrative and academic activities. The entire functioning of the college is carried out under the leadership of the Head of the institution. An efficient and effective leadership is also carried out through decentralization in the form of setting up of various policy making bodies such as Advisory Committee, IQAC, RUSA and Building Committee, UGC-Differently-abled Persons' Committee, Alumni Association, Sports Committee, NCC, NSS, Research Committee, Women Development Cell, Legal Literacy Cell, Youth and Cultural Society, Discipline Committee, Scholarship Committee, Time-Table Committee, Anti-Raging Cell, Placement Cell, RTI Cell, AISHE, SHREYAS NAD, etc. These committees are comprised of faculty members, who hold periodic meetings and review the matter concerning activities. Though the session took off smoothly in July 2019, the latter half, March onwards was exposed to numerous challenges brought about by the pandemic. However, our teachers adapted to the new mode of teaching quite successfully by imparting lessons to their students through various online portals like Google Meet, G-Suite, Zoom and YouTube. Information was given to students through academic WhatsApp groups made by the concerned teacher. 02 faculty members uploaded their lectures on YouTube under the banner of Director, Higher Education, Panchkula which were telecast on Utkarsh and Medical students from all over Haryana were benefitted. •During the lockdown, the college organized various Inter-college, State level and National level online competitions. Even the students of the college participated in various Inter-college, State level and National level Competitions, organized by various other colleges and brought laurels for the institution. •The college has a Wall Magazine which contains articles by the students to enhance their writing skills. It is also available on the college website.

Examination and Evaluation

• The college abides by the rules and

regulations regarding examination and evaluation drafted by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. • Apart from the end semester examination, this is conducted by the university. The teachers evaluate the students internally on the basis of their attendance, class performance, presentations, assignment grades and their performance in the sessionals.

Extra weightage is given to the students who represent our college at the University, State and National levels in various activities like Sports, NCC/NSS, Youth Festival, RD Parade, Science Exhibitions and Quiz Competitions etc. • The examination for the January-May 2020 semester was conducted in blended mode across the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, in accordance with UGC-NET schedule, due to the COVID-19 pandemic situation in the country. These exams were conducted only for UG PG IV VI semester (Regular/Re-appear). Rest of the students were promoted to the next semester by the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. • The evaluation and the awards are uploaded by the college staff on the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra portal. • If any of our student having health issues or domestic problems that hinder their regularity, they are generally helpless in such situations. Hence, the College Advisory Committee and the Examination Committee examines the cause behind short attendance and exempts such students from fine.

National/International Journals, big reading-hall, book bank, internet and Photostat facility. • Big multipurpose Auditorium with a seating capacity of 2000. • A huge and well supplied hygienic canteen. A common room with indoor sports facilities. • Science building with lift along with a well-designed, air-conditioned seminar hall equipped with multimedia. • Sports Ground at Village Daniyalpur spreading over 03 acres of land. • A lively and cheerful hostel campus with a living capacity of 300 students, an adequate dining room, well-regulated mess, hygienic toilets and ultramodern amenities like geysers, drinking water coolers with R.O., incinerator, 24x7 Generator facility, A.C. rooms, TV, common room, guest room and computer room with Internet facility. • Gardens with well-manicured grass and beautiful flowers in the college premises and the hostel. • A Cosmetology laboratory with latest facilities offering excellent training and beauty services at nominal charges. • Students are provided with a secure environment through security services, CCTV Cameras, etc. • R.O. and water coolers installed at all major points. • Home Science Block Commerce Block and Science block have lift facility for differently-abled students. • To promote healthy lifestyle and to inculcate in students the habit of exercising as a part of their daily routine, the college has an open gym. Human Resource Management

•The college has a very effective mechanism for allocation of duties and responsibilities to faculty of consonance with their aptitude, talent and ability. In the beginning of every session, the Principal calls a meeting to spot the unique talent and abilities of individual teachers and charge of various clubs committees is handed over to them accordingly. •Along with the routine classroom teaching, the faculty of the college is also engaged in various curricular and extra-curricular activities. Hence, there is an optimal use of human resource that gives confidence to tackle every type of academic/non-academic challenges. •Orientation and training programmes

are periodically organized for fresh appointees, both for teaching and non-teaching staff, in order to enhance their skills, working capacity, potential and a clear understanding of work culture. •Faculty members are encouraged to apply for higher studies. Six faculty members were felicitated for completing their Doctoral Research during service on Convocation. •Students are an integral part of the college and a significant human resource. They are involved in the process of decision making and planning. Depending on their aptitude and ability, students are assigned leadership roles like Head Girls of all three streams-Arts, Science Commerce and also in Hostel, Class Representatives and Volunteers of different Clubs Societies. Their opinions and suggestions are invited periodically by holding the meetings of the Students Council. • Mentor Groups have been formed to guide, counsel and assist students. For a group of minimum 22 students one teacher is appointed as mentor. I. STRENGTHENING YOUNG SCHOLARS: The Context: The fast changing contemporary world tends to confuse the young learners about the choices they make. With the rapidly emerging trend to seek education from foreign universities, the drop-out rate was reaching alarming numbers. The practice to retain such learners was undertaken by the college. Objectives: To assist the students in understanding the futility of 'foreign degree' which is a strain on the pocket and is also an obstacle to the true academic growth. Also, to inform the students regarding the multifarious applicability of the courses being pursued by them. . The Practice: The staff undertook the responsibility to counsel every case that took the option to discontinue studies. Such cases included students dropping out because of financial difficulties, health issues, lack of support from family, and those who were lured by the glamour of 'foreign degrees'. Special personal sessions were conducted with such students in the presence of their parents/guardians. It was conveyed that how their impressionable tender age and vulnerability was being exploited by the agents who facilitated migration. In addition, such students were made aware of the multiple skill-enhancing courses available in the college like Functional English, Cosmetology, Fashion Designing etc. .Aid/concessions were provided to those who faced financial difficulties or were bothered by health issues. This practice not only checked the growing dropout rate but also reinforced the importance of education for women. **II. GARNERING GREENERY:** The Context: Owing to general apathy towards the environment and lack of awareness, Global Warming is slyly

spreading its tentacles. However, the college is continually making efforts to contain the harmful consequences of this demon. Apart from initiatives undertaken by the Eco-club, students and staff also participate enthusiastically in state guided activities devoted to reduce the harmful impacts on environment. Objectives: To maintain the green-cover and generate awareness about its significance for life. The Practice :The Eco club of the college conducts regular tree plantation drives and competitions, rallies, etc. to generate awareness about the essential role of greenery in our lives. The Sankalp Sutra Bandhan day was celebrated on August 25, 2018 by tying the 'sutra' to trees on campus pledging to safeguard them. This not only channelized the energy in a positive manner but also helped to create a sense of responsibility towards Earth - our home.
