- Maintaining academic excellence with majority of contractual staff.
- Promoting research culture.
- Retaining meritorious UG students for PG courses.

Plan of Action

1. Teaching/Learning Enhancement:

- a) **Introduction to New Courses:** Give preference to the introduction of fresh courses for students, encompassing skills, ethics, capacity enhancement, and interdisciplinary subjects, to align with evolving academic needs and enrich student prospects.
- b) **E-content Development:** Allocate resources in creating high-quality e-learning materials to support diverse learning styles and promote self-directed learning.
- c) **YouTube Channel & Social Media Presence:** Emphasize the development of engaging multimedia content and active social media engagement to reach and engage a wider audience of learners.
- d) **Botanical/ Herbal Garden:** Botanical Garden to be a unique learning space to facilitate hands-on, experiential learning opportunities and promote environmental stewardship.

2. Employability Enhancement:

- a) **Internship Opportunities:** Establish robust internship programs with industry partners to provide students with real-world experience and enhance their employability.
- b) **Vocational Courses/Entrepreneurship:** Create a supportive ecosystem for aspiring entrepreneurs, and prioritize the development of vocational training programs aligned with industry needs to equip students with practical skills and enhance their career prospects.
- c) **Incubation Centre:** Establish an Incubation Centre to nurture entrepreneurial ventures and facilitate their growth from idea creation to market launch, fostering innovation and start-up success.

- a) **Publication Incentives:** Provide faculty with incentives and support to publish research papers in high quality journals (Scopus, UGC Care listed, Peer-reviewed) and books, enhancing the college's research reputation and contributing to knowledge dissemination.
- b) **Research Projects:** Encourage faculty involvement in interdisciplinary research projects, applying for Major/Minor Research Projects to various funding agencies, providing consultancies, fostering collaboration and innovation while addressing societal challenges.
- c) **Research Supervision:** Support faculty in applying to university as Research Guides/ Supervisors in conducting high-quality research, contributing to the development of future scholars and researchers.
