15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The college fosters holistic development by offering comprehensive education in Arts, Science, and Commerce, preparing students for a tech-driven global community. Emphasizing academic and practical learning, its programmes adapt to a dynamic environment. Aligned with NEP 2020, the college's multidisciplinary, skill-based approach equips students for success in a rapidly evolving technological landscape. As an affiliate of Kurukshetra University, it integrates NEP's flexible framework with established academic guidelines, offering diverse undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. Courses like B.Voc. (Fashion Technology) and B. Voc. (Food Science and Quality Control) feature a credit system with multiple exit options, allowing students to earn a diploma, advanced diploma, or full degree based on their needs. The innovative curriculum promotes interdisciplinary learning. B.A. students can select multidisciplinary courses (MDCs) in sciences like Physics and Mathematics, Commerce and BBA students explore Fashion Designing, BCA students study Personal Finance, and Science students opt for humanities like History and Economics. The credit system further enables students to customize their academic paths. Clubs and societies like NSS, NCC (Army and Air Wing), Sahyog Club, Women Cell, ICCASH, Eco Club, and Youth Red Cross foster leadership, teamwork, and social responsibility while promoting community engagement and environmental education.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The college adopted NEP 2020 following the instructions and framework established by the affiliating university Kurukshetra University (KUK) and the directives of Directorate of Higher Education, Haryana. This adoption represents a significant shift towards a more multidisciplinary and student-centric approach to education. By integrating the ABC facility, we are committed to providing our students with the ability to manage and utilize their academic credits more effectively. The Academic Bank of Credit system enables students to register for KUK-approved courses across disciplines, accumulate transferable credits, and design their academic journey to align with personal and professional goals. One of the key advantages of the ABC facility is the ease of credit transfer it offers. The students can transfer their credits to other KUK-affiliated institutions if

they wish to continue their studies elsewhere. Conversely, credits earned from other recognized institutions can be transferred to our college, facilitating a smoother academic transition. This reduces the redundancy of repeating similar courses and helps students make the most of their previous learning experiences. The adoption of NEP 2020 and the ABC system at our college also supports the holistic development of students by encouraging them to engage in interdisciplinary learning.

17.Skill development:

The college aligns with NEP 2020 offering growth opportunities. Through 16 MoUs and and numerous collaborative initiatives in 2023-24, it provides experiential learning, equipping students with essential skills. The focus is on enhancing academic knowledge and practical competencies, addressing skill gaps, and offering targeted courses for students. The college offers Skill Enhancement Courses as Olericulture in Botany; Basic IT Tools, Cloud Computing, Advanced IT Tools, and Data Management in Computer Science; Numerical Ability Enhancement Skill and Quantitative Aptitude in Mathematics; Analytical Chemistry and Waste Management Techniques in Chemistry; and Soft Skills and Communication in Professional Life in English, while value-added courses in Human Values, Ethics, and Environmental Studies foster moral education and sustainable practices. Students are encouraged to engage in clubs like NCC, NSS, YRC, Eco Club, Women Cell, and Sahyog Club, promoting leadership, teamwork, and social awareness. To enhance employability, the college provides add-on courses in Functional English, Fashion Designing, Beauty Culture, Web Designing, and Multimedia and Diploma in Health Care. It is also introducing diplomas in Elderly Caretaker, and Child Caretaker from next session. Seminars, workshops, and career guidance sessions further improve career prospects, helping students become competent, confident, and socially responsible for diverse career paths.

At present, the college does not offer distance education courses, as these are provided exclusively by the affiliating university. The college adheres only to the courses and modes

To support students, the college actively raises awareness about distance education opportunities offered by institutions such as IGNOU and SWAYAM, helping students explore additional educational avenues aligned with their professional goals. With the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in the 2023-24 academic session, the college introduced online extra classes to complement regular classroom learning. These classes provide flexibility for students to revisit challenging concepts, clear doubts, and access supplementary resources. Platforms like Google Meet, WhatsApp, and Google Classroom enable teachers to engage large groups of students simultaneously, ensuring uninterrupted learning. Additionally, recorded lectures, PowerPoint presentations, and educational content are shared through YouTube and WhatsApp groups, enhancing access to study materials. While distance education remains under the university's purview, the college is proactive in providing online learning opportunities and raising awareness about external programs.

In order to facilitate the creation of a sustainable environment and delve into the consciousness of generating less waste, a recycling process is undertaken that passes waste through a system that enables the used material to be reused thus ensuring that fewer natural resources are consumed. The college segregates waste into solid and liquid waste and proper management is ensured on the college campus. The solid waste on campus is managed by collecting it in separate bins for wet and dry waste and it is further collected by the waste collection dumpers employed by the Karnal Municipal Corporation.

In order to make use of the leaf litter on college campus, it is assembled in a compost pit and used as manure after appropriate decomposition. The liquid waste generated in science labs, hostels, canteen, etc. is directed to municipal drainage systems via underground pipelines, and regular monitoring is done to ensure that waste from laboratories don't contain any hazardous chemicals.

E-waste is stored appropriately and disposed off annually under the supervision of senior faculty from the Departmentof Computers Science. The principle of Reuse, Reduce, and Recycle is followed to minimize waste generation and use resources optimally.
