<p>1.Under the vigilant stewardship of the IQAC, faculty and students are led and monitored in their pursuit of quality assurance and enhancement. Faculty members provide invaluable guidance, enabling the students to harmonize and excel in their co-curricular and extra-curricular accomplishments along with their academics. For the session 2022-23, the college celebrated a remarkable achievement with 42 university merits, an impressive collection of 02 silver medals (01 mixed double and 01 individual), 01 bronze medal (team) and 10 participations at national level, 03 gold medals (02 team and 01 individual) and 01 Silver Medal (Team) at state level, and 06 gold medals (03 team and 03 individual), 02 silver medals (individual) 02 bronze medals (individuals) at inter-college level in the domain of sports, 01 student represented Haryana in the National Youth Parliament at Parliament House, New Delhi on November 14, 2022 and the other student, twice, on December 25, 2022 and March 01-02, 2023 respectively and 03 outstanding placements of students in various esteemed organization/companies. Moreover, our students were imbued with inspiration to engage in competitions hosted by our college and other institutions, securing numerous accolades and prizes, aiming at fostering knowledge enrichment, and bolstering their self-assurance. The IQAC upheld the college's standards, contributing to its comprehensive growth and recognition. 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The college offers a wide spectrum of undergraduate and postgraduate programs spanning the fields of Arts, Science, and Commerce. As an affiliate of Kurukshetra University, Haryana, the institution meticulously follows the established guidelines and directives of the university. It is well-prepared to embrace the comprehensive multidisciplinary approach introduced by NEP 2020, and it will adhere to the university's plans and procedures, including the incorporation of a credit system. The college prides itself on its myriad clubs and societies, such as NSS, NCC (Army & Air Wing), Sahyog Club, Women Cell, ICCASH, Eco Club, Youth Red Cross, Red Ribbon, Arya Yuvti Parishad, and more, all dedicated to promoting community engagement, environmental education, and values-based learning, thereby fostering a holistic and multidisciplinary educational experience. These societies and clubs warmly welcome students from diverse academic backgrounds. The institution offers a flexible multidisciplinary curriculum for B. Voc. (Fashion Technology) and B. Voc. (Food Science and Quality Control), offering multiple exit points - a Diploma after the first year, an Advanced Diploma after the second year, and a Degree after the third year. For other courses, the college meticulously adheres to the guidelines set by the affiliating university. Additionally, new short-term and vocational courses have been introduced during academic breaks. As a leading women-focused institution, the college actively encourages and empowers students to explore self-employment and entrepreneurship, thereby championing women's empowerment.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The adoption of ABC has not yet been implemented by the college. However, it is scheduled to be integrated in accordance with the guidelines and directives provided by Kurukshetra University, our affiliating institution from the session 2023-24. In alignment with these guidelines, new courses may be introduced under the credit system. Moreover, the college actively encourages students to explore courses available under platforms such as SWAYAM, etc.

17. Skill development:

The college offers B. Voc. Programs in Fashion Technology and Food Science & Quality Control, complemented by additional certificates awarded by Sector Skill Council following a specialized examination. Furthermore, the institution offers an array of add-on courses

including Functional English, Fashion Designing, Beauty Culture and Cosmetology, Food Processing and Preservation, Web Designing, Multimedia, Animation, GIS, and Remote Sensing, along with a Diploma in Health Care (Community College). These courses are designed to develop students' skills, enabling them to pursue self-employment and entrepreneurship opportunities. The college places a strong emphasis on value-based education, instilling a sense of positivity among the students through various activities such as yajnas/havans, motivational lectures, workshops, and the celebration of national and international days. Students receive guidance and support for creating projects to participate in Science Exhibitions at National, State, and District levels. Additionally, in alignment with the directives of NEP 2020 set forth by the affiliating university, the college will adapt the courses accordingly.

The college offers the courses made accessible by the affiliating university. After implementation of NEP 2020 by the university, the college will adopt courses as per the directions of the affiliating university. Planning to offer Short Term Courses on Indian Languages may be offered.

The college follows the university's evaluation procedures. Transparent and robust evaluation process in terms of frequency and variety. The students' performance is accessed continuously through tests, assignments, projects, presentations, workshops, and group discussions.

The internal evaluation process includes:

1. Two Handwritten Assignments (Ist Assignment after one month & IInd Assignment after two months) - 10%
2. One Class Test/Sessional - 5%
3. Attendance - 5%.

The Examination Committee floats the schedule of the class test. Assignments, class tests/sessionals are discussed during the class after evaluation by respective teachers. It aims to provide sufficient transparency and accountability. The students' performance is displayed on the notice board and communicated to the students. The teachers pay particular attention to non-performing students. 4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The College has different academic blocks viz. Kalpana block, including Chemistry, Botany, Geography, Zoology, Biotechnology and Physics departments; Hansraj block, having Home Science, Commerce and Mathematics departments and Dayanand Arts block. There are adequate classrooms, laboratories and seminar halls. Hostel facility is provided to students from distant areas.

Departments are equipped with projectors, visualizers, computer equipment like desktops, laptops, printers, photocopy machines, Wi-Fi connections etc. 'Central laboratory' has assets like PCR, BOD Incubator, Fluorescent and Inverted microscope, Laminar air flow chambers, Computer attached UV Illuminator, Double beam spectrophotometer, etc. Zoology lab has a museum with approximately 200 specimens. 'GIS Laboratory of Geography Department' has 10 licensed ArcGIS software. 'Home Science department' possesses labs like 'Food and Nutrition', 'Food Science and Quality Control', 'Fashion Designing', 'Fashion Technology' & 'Garment Construction' 'Cosmetology' Labs. 'Physics lab' has equipments like, Radio Frequency Oscillator, Helium Neon Laser, Cathode Ray Oscilloscope, etc. 'Botany lab' is has Compound and Dissection microscopes, Binoculars, Specimens, etc. 'Chemistry lab' has Spectrophotometers, Water Deioniser, Polarimeter and Digital Melting Point Apparatus.

Admission Committee

In order to facilitate the creation of a sustainable environment and delve into the consciousness of generating less waste, a recycling process is undertaken that passes waste through a system that enables the used material to be reused thus ensuring that fewer natural resources are consumed.

The college segregates waste into solid and liquid waste and proper management is ensured on the college campus. The solid waste on campus is managed by collecting it in separate bins for wet and dry waste and it is further collected by the waste collection dumpers employed by the Karnal Municipal Corporation. In order to make use of the leaf litter on college campus, it is assembled in a compost pit and used as manure after appropriate decomposition.

The liquid waste generated in science labs, hostels, canteen, etc. is directed to municipal drainage systems via underground pipelines, and regular monitoring is done to ensure that waste from laboratories don't contain any hazardous chemicals.

E-waste is stored appropriately and disposed off annually under the supervision of senior faculty from the Depart. of Computers. The principle of Refuse, Reduce, Repurpose, and Recycle is followed to minimize waste generation and use resources optimally.
